Along the way they encounter Nestuh, a giant spider who can spin a story but not a web; Baron Zonip, a hummingbird king who rules a wildly wealthy treetop kingdom; and an enchantress named Nanni who, with her shadow army of Upsetters, may be bent on conquering Xamaica and stealing its magic.

In order to save his sister and his friends, Dylan must solve a dangerous mystery in three days and uncover secrets about Xamaica, his family, and himself. But will he discover his hidden powers before two worlds—Xamaica and Earth—are completely destroyed?

C.J. Farley is the author of two novels for adults and a number of nonfiction books, including the biography *Before the Legend: The Rise of Bob Marley* and a best-selling nonfiction title for younger readers, *Aaliyah: More Than a Woman*. Farley is a former music critic and senior editor for *Time* magazine, and a graduate of Harvard University, where he served as an editor for the *Harvard Lampoon*. He's currently a senior editor, columnist, and blogger at the *Wall Street Journal*.

# **Ballad Blexbolex**

Ballad is a story. It is also a narrative song, and like all great stories, it deepens with each retelling.

This image-based story builds page by page, over seven rounds or sequences. The initial round consists of three images: the beginning: school; the middle: the path; and the end: home. The next round builds upon the first, and here we have: school, the street, the path, the forest, and home. The next five sequences take up this same story, but with new words and images integrated each time, while repeating the images and words from earlier rounds. Thus the story quickly becomes enormous, as the number of new images nearly doubles with each round. The story that *Ballad* tells plays with the stories that we make up and tell ourselves as we move through the world. Here we are given a child's encounter with the world as he returns home from school each day, and we see how a child's own small world can suddenly become enormous. The story that is told here is as old as the world. It happens every day.

**Blexbolex** is a bold and highly talented graphic artist. In addition to creating numerous comics, he has been internationally acclaimed for his books *Seasons*, which was selected as a 2012 New York Times Book Review Best Illustrated Book of the Year, and *People*, which received the prestigious Goldene Letter Award in 2009 for "Best Book Design throughout the World."

Lois Duncan was a young wife and mother of two when she decided to write a novel to pay the bills. The result was Debutante Hill. The novel was originally rejected for consideration in the Dodd, Mead and Company's Seventeenth Summer literary contest due to one character drinking a beer, but after Duncan swapped in a soft drink, she won the prize, which paid the down payment on her first house.

Since then, Duncan has written over fifty novels, receiving worldwide acclaim for her young adult fiction. She pioneered the teen suspense novel and is a regular nominee for the Edgar Allen Poe award. In 1992 Duncan was awarded the Margaret A. Edwards Award For a Distinguished Body of Work for Young Adults. Her novels I Know What You Did Last Summer and Hotel for Dogs have been adapted into popular films.


# To All My Fans, With Love, From Sylvie Ellen Conford
